

How to Cite BRC:

We use MLA format for citing. The citation on BRC is **not** MLA format.

Cite BRC references like this:

Author. "Article Title." *Title of Encyclopedia*, ___ ed. ___ vols. (Year of article). Biography Resource Center. Gale Cengage. Huntley Area Public Library. Date retrieved <http://galenet.galegroup.com/servlet/BioRC>.

Example: (no author for this article)

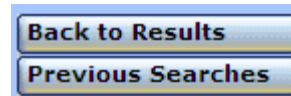

How to move in BRC:

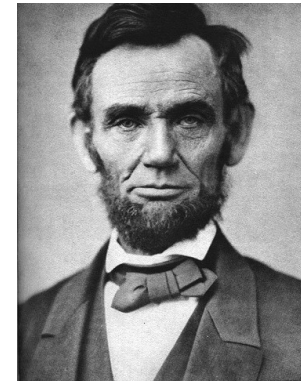
You can either print or email articles you want to keep. Click on the print or email icons in the top left corner of the screen:



You can also use the buttons on the left hand side of the page to go back to your article list by clicking **Back to Results**; or, you can look up other searches you have done during that session by clicking **Previous Searches**.

The Biography Resource Center is a comprehensive database of biographical information on over 320,000 people from throughout history, around the world, and across all disciplines and subject areas.



How to get to BRC

1) Go to the public library website: <http://www.huntleylibrary.org/>

2) In the left column, under Online Resources, click **Biographies**.

3) Click **Biography Resource Center**.

4) Type in your library card number and click **proceed**.

5) Click in the search box and type the name of the person you want to find:

Search by Name

Name contains Start of last name

6) Then, you will get a list of results:

- [Jones, John Paul \(1950-\)](#)
- [Jones, John Paul \(American military leader, 1747-1792\)](#)
- [Jones, John Paul \(American probation officer, 1944-\)](#)
- [Jones, John Paul \(British bass guitarist, 1946-\)](#)
- [Jones, John Paul, Jr. \(American writer, 1912-2001\)](#)

7) Click on the right person. The list describes their occupation and birth/death dates.

8) You will then get a list of articles about that person and a set of tabs at the top of the page:



9) **Biographies** is your article list. Each article will say what book it is from, the date it was published, and how many words are in the article. These sources are mainly from encyclopedias.

Brief Biographies is the same list but takes out the longer articles.

Magazines and News has a list of articles that your person appears in. Each article may be about that person, or the article may contain the person's name. The articles are not all biographical.

Websites list online sites that are about your person.

The list that shows on your screen depends on the tab you have clicked on.
